Intended Use

For In Vitro Diagnostic Use. This antibody is designed for the specific localization of PTEN in formalin-fixed, paraffinembedded (FFPE) tissue sections. Evaluation must be performed by a qualified pathologist.

Summary and Explanation

Phosphatase and tensin homologue deleted chromosome TEN (at 10q23) (PTEN) is a tumor suppressor and a member in the PI3K/PTEN/Akt pathway. PTEN gene encodes a 403 amino acid cytosolic lipid phosphatase that negatively dephosphorylating regulates **AKT** activity by phosphatidylinositol 3,4,5-trisphosphate (PIP₃). The defects of PTEN have been implicated in human cancers from breast, prostate, thyroid, skin, endometrium, head and neck, and brain. Up to 50-60 percent of advanced prostate cancers show abnormal PTEN gene expression or loss of protein expression.

Storage and Handling

Store at 2-8°C. Fresh dilutions, if required, should be prepared prior to use and are stable and steady for up to one day at room temperature (20-26°C). Diluted antibody preparations can be refrigerated or frozen for extended shelf life.

Principles of the Procedure

Antigen detection by immunohistochemistry (IHC) is a two-step process wherein the primary antibody binds to the antigen of interest and that binding is detected by a chromogen. The primary antibody may be used in IHC using manual techniques or BioGenex Automated Staining System. Positive and negative controls should always be run simultaneously with all patient specimens.

Reagents Provided

Mouse Monoclonal Antibody to PTEN is affinity purified and diluted in PBS, pH 7.2, containing 1% BSA and 0.09% sodium

Dilution of Primary Antibody

BioGenex Ready-to-Use antibodies have been optimized for use with the recommended BioGenex Detection System and should not require further dilution.

BioGenex concentrated antibodies must be diluted in accordance with the recommended protocol when used with the recommended BioGenex Detection System.

Expected Results

This antibody stains membrane/cytoplasm in positive cells in formalin-fixed, paraffin embedded tissue sections. An example image of a tissue section stained with this antibody can be found on the product page on the BioGenex website. Interpretation of the staining result is solely the responsibility of the user. Experimental results should be confirmed by a medically-established diagnostic product or procedure.

Limitations of the Procedure

Improper tissue handling and processing prior to immunostaining can lead to inconsistent results. Variations in embedding and fixation or the nature of the tissue may lead to variations in results. Endogenous peroxidase activity or pseudo peroxidase activity in erythrocytes and tissue biotin may result in non-specific staining based on the detection system employed. Tissues containing Hepatitis B Surface Antigen (HBsAg) may give false positive with horseradish peroxidase systems. Improper counterstaining and mounting may compromise the interpretation of results.
